

TUBERCULAR HOSPITAL TO OPEN ON SATURDAY

NAME OF "WOODLAWN" SELECTED BY MEDICAL ASSOCIATION.

County and City Officials Formulate Program—Many Prominent Citi- zens to Speak.

The tubercular hospital, built jointly by the city and county for the reception and treatment of indigent consumptives who are bona fide residents of Dallas, city and county, will be formally opened Saturday afternoon. Patients, however, will not be admitted into the new institution until the middle of next week.

Including grounds and equipment the new tubercular hospital represents a cost of about \$50,000. It is located about a mile and a half north of Parkland Hospital. The roads are in good condition, and the hospital may be reached either in automobiles or horse-drawn vehicles. An invitation is extended the public to attend the opening ceremonies Saturday afternoon, and inspect the new buildings, which will be open to all visitors at this time.

Mayor Holland and County Commissioner Miller, in conference yesterday morning, decided that the formal opening should be at 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon. The County Judge and members of the County Commissioners' Court will meet at the City Hall at 3 P. M., and with the Mayor and City Commissioners, and officers and Board of Directors of the United Charities, and other citizens, will start in automobiles for the new hospital. Mayor Holland said that a special invitation is extended the officers and directors of the United Charities to attend, and that it is desired that all citizens who care to do so go out to the exercises. Addresses will be made by the following:

Alex Sanger, vice president Texas Anti-Tuberculosis Association; George R. Dealey, president United Charities; County Judge Q. D. Conley; former County Judge John L. Young; City Commissioner W. T. Henderson; former City Commissioner J. E. Lee; County Commissioner Jim Miller; County Commissioner C. D. Smith; City Health Officer Nash and County Health Officer Field.

The new institution is to be named Woodlawn Hospital, at the suggestion of the County Medical Association. This association was requested to suggest a name, and the one they decided upon will be the official designation.

Mayor Holland considered it important that the public should understand that the hospital is built for the relief of indigent consumptives who are bona fide residents of the city or county of Dallas, and that those who do not answer this description can not be admitted. The hospital is built upon an eminence commanding a view of the West Dallas hills and insuring the effect of every breeze. A sewerage line is practically built from Woodlawn and the Union Hospital to the river at a cost of \$1,800, the final work to be completed within a few days.

Meet 9th Saturday Morning.

Saturday morning the City and County Commissioners will hold a joint meeting to confer upon a suggestion that each body take jurisdiction over one of the two hospitals now conducted jointly by the city and county bodies. These are the Union Hospital, where smallpox cases are treated, and the new tubercular hospital. It has been suggested that the County Commissioners take complete control of the tubercular hospital and the City Commissioners of the smallpox hospital. No agreement has been reached, but Mayor Holland considers the division suggested rather a desirable one, since it is possible that conditions might obtain under which it would be most desirable for the city government to have absolute charge of the smallpox hospital.

The Mayor said last night that he knew of no conference for the discussion of the establishing of a hospital for the cure of persons with drug habits.
