

40-Year Dallas Physician, Dr. Charles Thornton, Dies

Dr. Charles William Thornton, 62, practicing physician in Dallas for more than 40 years, died of a heart attack Sunday in Hobbs, N.M. He had been in ill health for the last two years.

Dr. Thornton had resided in Hobbs with his daughter, Mrs. Bob Wilson, for two years.

A native of Nevada, Mo., Dr. Thornton was graduated from Beaumont Hospital Medical College in St. Louis, Mo., in 1893. He did post graduate studies in New York and Chicago before opening his practice in Deerfield, Mo., in 1894.

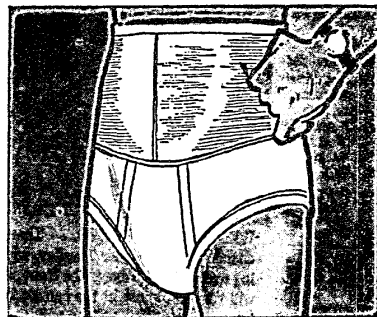
Charles Alsop

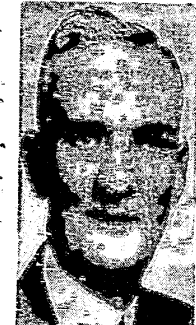

Dr. Roy Goggans, 67, head of the Dallas City TB Control Center since 1947, died Sunday in a Dallas hospital after an illness of seven weeks.

A lifelong resident of Heath and Rockwall County, Darr died Sunday. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge for 52 years and a Baptist.

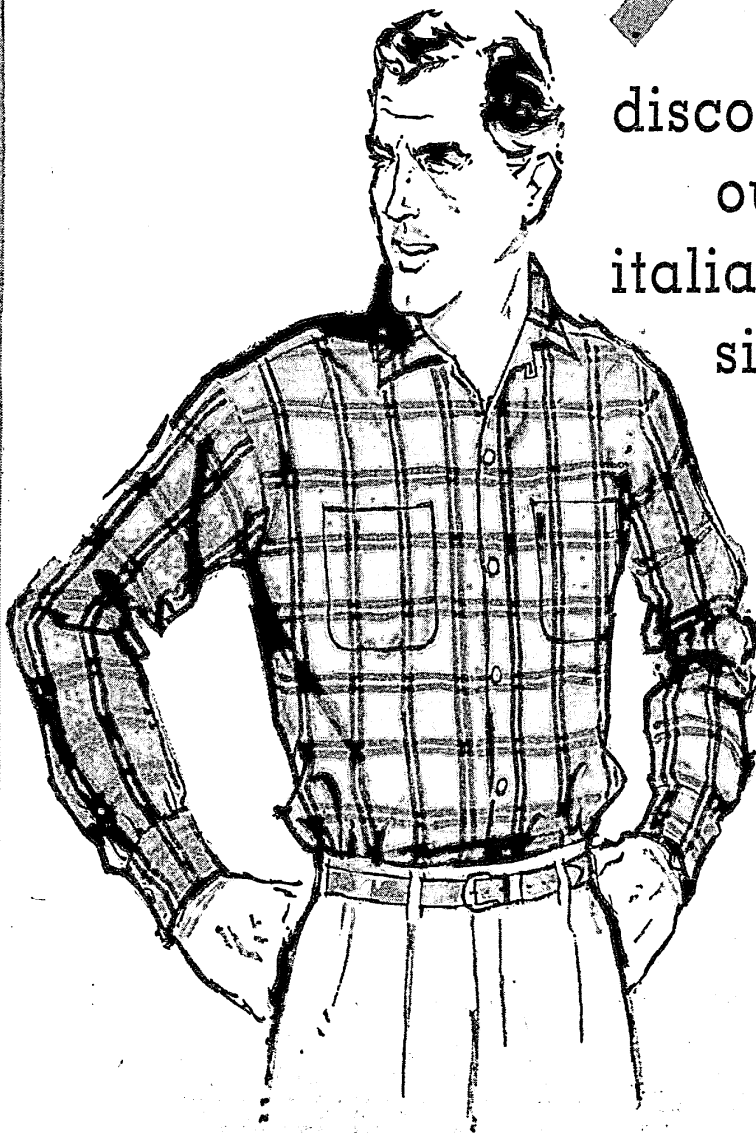
The Rev. S. B. Hamilton, Fort Worth, will conduct the funeral.
