Woodlawn Hospital Pushes Remodeling

Woodlawn Hospital, which Monday will complete a major unit of its 2-year-old remodeling program, is on its way to becoming one of the nation's top centers for chest diseases, officials said Saturday.

While the tuberculosis problem lessens (the average stay of a TB patient at Woodlawn has been cut in half, from 260 to 130 days, in the last five years), other chest diseases such as emphysema and bronchitis are increasing.

Dr. Charles A. LeMaistre of Atlanta, Ga., will arrive in Dallas Tuesday to become medical director of the 168-bed chest-disease division of Woodlawn, a tax-supported hospital of the Dallas County Hospital District.

Located at 3819 Maple (the old Parkland), Woodlawn's internal facelift has made it a cheerful, bright, young-looking place inside.

Color rules the redecorated third floor and the completed portion of the second floor—pinks, oranges, tans, greens, yellows. Some colors are soothing, some are bracing, some soft, some bold, but all in a clean new morale-builders for patients.

There's a new barber and beauty shop—also important to the morale of long-term patients. Floors are smooth asphalt tile, in contrast to the concrete in the uncompleted part of the hospital. Much tile, formica and stainless steel have been used, since they are easy to keep clean — and cleanliness is vital in a communicable disease hospital.

A portion of this cheerful new section once housed the old Parkland polio ward, in the dark days

before Salk vaccine. At times there were 8 or 10 ironing-patients being cared for at once.

The remodeling pace at Woodlawn has been slowed by two major factors: (1) It had to be done a section at a time, because there has always been a nearly full house of patients; (2) the financing of the current renovation program has been on a quarter-to-quarter basis, with appropriations from a rather tight operating budget.

So far, \$420,000 has been spent on the renovation (this is in addition to a \$284,000 bond program Tuesday to become medical director of the 168-bed chest-disease division of Woodlawn, a tax-supported hospital of the Dallas County Hospital District.

The remodeled Woodlawn nurses' home now houses the county's psychiatric cases (52 beds).

Yet to be remodeled is the ground floor of the main Woodlawn building.

Negro TB patients will move from the ground floor Tuesday to their newly finished quarters on the second floor. Eventually the ground floor will be done over to accommodate 55 to 60 patients now in the ancient Convalescent Hospital at Hutchins. Also to be established, on the opposite end of the ground floor, is a TB control center for outpatients.

E. Carlyle Smith of Grand Prairie, a member of the Dallas County Hospital District board, is overseer for the Woodlawn renovation.

SCHOOL OFFICIALS SET DATE FOR ENROLLMENT

Dallas students approached the end of a long summer holiday Saturday as school officials set the date for the starting of the new school term.

The Highland Park Independent School District will open schools Tuesday, Sept. 8. Students entering school for the first time should have vaccination certificates and show a good record of immunization against smallpox and diphtheria.

Schools will open in the Dallas Independent School District on Tuesday, Sept. 8. For students who will attend the 140-school Dallas district the following procedures will apply:

All students who have been promoted to a higher grade level school (from elementary to junior high, or junior high to senior high) will enroll at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 8, at the school they will attend this fall.

Junior and senior high school students who changed districts within the city and those who are new to the city will pre-enroll in their respective buildings from 10 a.m. to noon Monday, Aug. 31, through Friday, Sept. 4.

Elementary school pupils new to the Dallas district and those changing schools within the district will pre-enroll at their schools Monday, Aug. 31, or Friday, Sept. 4. Children beginning the first grade will enroll at 10 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 8.

Any child entering the first or second grade for the first time. A smallpox vaccination certificate and birth certificate must be presented.

At the junior high school, special orientation sessions in homeroom groups will be held for seventh grade students Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, Sept. 24, 25 and 26.

Students new to the junior high school should preregister at the junior high school during those days.

Incoming sophomore students will report to the high school for all-day orientation programs according to this schedule:

Students whose last names start with the letters A through L will report at 8:45 a.m. this Thursday and remain until 12:30 p.m. Students whose names begin with the letters M through Z and transfer students will follow the same schedule on Friday.

Transfer students, those who need schedule changes and those with work permits should preregister at the high school Sept. 1 through 4 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

On Sept. 5 an orientation meeting for new teachers will be held at 8:30 a.m. breakfast in the Robert S. Hyer Elementary School. Several faculty meetings will be held at 9:30 a.m. Sept. 7 in the University Park auditorium.

A full day of classes will be held beginning at 9 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 8, in each school.

Dutch Leaving Home

LYNDON JOHNSON SPEAKS

Bragging, Boasting Won't Impress Mr. K.

SAN AUGUSTINE, Texas (UPI)—Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson (Tex.) said Saturday night Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev will not be impressed by bragging or boasting but only by results during his forthcoming visit to the United States.

"Chamber of Commerce slogans will not impress a hardened Communist politician," he told the Deep East Texas Electric Co. operative.

He said there are "many who have grave doubts about the wisdom of Khrushchev being invited to this country. But these doubts—however well founded—are academic. He is coming to the United States as the guest of the President."

The Democratic leader said "the die has been cast" and "the only thing we can do is to han-
